The hardest thing about being single is being a Christian single. The coronavirus with its uncertainties has made being single even that more difficult.

What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith.

Because of Christ. Yes, all the things I once thought were so important are gone from my life. I didn't want some petty, inferior brand of righteousness that comes from keeping a list of rules when I could get the robust kind that comes from trusting Christ—God's righteousness.

The pursuit of Jesus Christ is your true testimony, everything else is window dressing.


